Table Notes

There are 21 families in the final NJFS sample. As many as eight individual cameras, numbered “1” through “8,” were used for the in-home video recording. NA means the corresponding camera number was not used for a particular household.

Room labels or camera views shown in the table are identical to descriptors added to the lower right-hand corners of the videos by staff from Princeton University’s Office of Information Technology (OIT) during camera setup. The “bedroom” label typically refers to the target child’s bedroom, which is sometimes shared with a sibling. The exception is household 1060. See footnote 3. A number following a room label refers to the first, second, or third camera in the given room. Several inconsistencies were introduced by OIT staff during the room labeling process. For example, for household 1010 there is “Living 2” but no “Living 1.” Other inconsistencies occur for households 1026, 1031, 1035, 1042, 1045, and 1061.

Cameras were attached to vertical spring-loaded poles or tension rods that were typically located out of the way in corners of rooms. Occasionally, a camera would become loose during a two-week recording session and either fall off the mounting pole or tilt downward altering the original camera angle. A family member would sometimes try to fix the problem. Issues of this kind arose in four instances:

- #1015, camera 7: the camera is displaced on 05/23/2017 at 09:29:52 to face the ground and is put back up again with a change in viewing angle on 05/23/2017 at 18:21:24.
- #1015, camera 8: the camera starts to shift and change view on 06/01/2017 at 20:14:49. On 06/01/2017 at 20:41:35, it completely faces the ground and stays so until the end of the recording.
- #1024, camera 4: the camera is displaced on 02/04/2017 at 06:38:20 to face the ground and is put back up again with a change in viewing angle on 02/04/2017 at 09:42:53.
- #1037, camera 6: the camera is displaced on 10/12/2017 at 11:32:13 to face the ground and is put back up again with a change in viewing angle on 10/17/2017 at 10:38:35.

Footnote 1: The “Changing” room, captured by camera #7 in household 1015, is a dressing room with drawers and closets where the children get dressed.

Footnote 2: The “Basement,” recorded by cameras #2 and #6 in household 1037, refers to a den-like space in the basement with sofas, chairs, and the like.

Footnote 3: In household 1060, “child bedroom” (camera #2) refers to the target child’s bedroom. “Bedroom” (camera #1) is an alternate sleeping area for the target child located in the parents’ bedroom.
